

PICKERING MEN'S SLO-PITCH LEAGUE

Special Ground Rules

In the interest of player safety, the following ground rules will apply at our diamonds

<i>Centennial</i>	Any batted ball that enters the tree area in left field or which is hit through the field entrances on the other diamond will be a ground rule triple.
<i>Dunmoore North</i>	When any fly ball is legally caught over fair territory the batter will be called out and the ball will remain alive, whether or not the ball brushes through overhanging branches of a tree in left field. Any fly ball that touches overhanging branches of a tree over fair territory and subsequently shanks into foul territory will be ruled a "dead ball" and a ground rule double. As soon as a fly ball touches any overhanging branches of a tree over foul territory the ball will immediately be ruled a "dead ball, foul" whether the ball is caught or not. Any overthrown ball that enters the tree line in left field will immediately be ruled a "dead ball" and base runners will be awarded two bases at the time of the throw. Any fair batted ground ball that subsequently enters the tree line or passes beyond the outfield fence in foul territory will be ruled a "dead ball" ground rule double.
<i>Dunmoore South</i>	No special ground rules.
<i>Kinsmen North</i>	No special ground rules.
<i>Kinsmen South</i>	No special ground rules.
<i>William Dunbar North</i>	No special ground rules.
<i>William Dunbar South</i>	A fair, fly ball that lands on the William Dunbar North diamond playing field or in the ravine will be ruled a "home run". Any fair batted ball that bounds into the William Dunbar North diamond playing field or the ravine in the outfield will be ruled a "ground rule triple."
